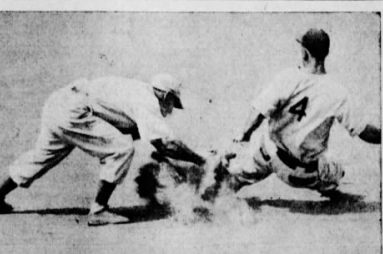
Paul Dean, hitting four-hits and driving in four runs, was the star of the game. He was the only player to hit a home run in the first game and the only player to hit a home run in the second game.
