Hyndman Wins Cup Golf on 2 Courses

Billy Hyndman, former Philadelphia champion, went around two golf courses in a total of 147 strokes yesterday to win the 44th annual Joseph Henry Patterson Memorial Cup.

The six-foot, three-inch Huntingdon Valley star opened with a forenoon round of 72 on the Flourtown course of the Philadelphia Cricket Club, and clinched the trophy by finishing with a 75 on the Whitemarsh Valley Country Club links.
