

## State Grants 5th License for Harness Races

HARRISBURG, Aug. 4 (AP).—The State Harness Racing Commission awarded a license Monday to a club which will conduct racing at The Meadows in Washington County beginning Aug. 12.

The club, Mountain Laurel Racing, Inc., was the first to win the state's fifth harness racing license over four other applicants including one from Erie, one from Reading and another from the Pocono.

**SHARE FACILITIES**  
The racing association will share the facilities at The Meadows with an already operating license. In seeking the license, attorney Melvin Schwartz said the racing commission this sharing would make The Meadows a sounder operation financially by spreading out the overhead over a longer period of time.

Mountain Laurel was granted permission to conduct 62 nights of racing from Aug. 12 to Nov. 3 with the park being closed Monday.

The commission announced its decision was reached after considering what "was in the best interest of the Commonwealth and the best interest of the harness racing industry."

**IMMEDIATE TAXES**  
The commission noted that "since Mountain Laurel was prepared to begin racing immediately, the Commonwealth will benefit immediately from the tax revenues."

Mountain Laurel will open its racing season within days after the regular Meadows racing season closes.

Other standardized tracks already in operation are located near Wilkes-Barre at Pocono Downs and in Philadelphia at Liberty Bell Park where two associations hold meetings.

Two of the unsuccessful bids for the new license would have located plants in Western Pennsylvania while the other two wanted Eastern Pennsylvania locations.

## Arnold Palmer Two Schools of Thought on Putting

There are two popular methods of taking the putter back from the ball. The first (illustration #1) has the putter moving straight back with the putterface always looking at the right angle to the putting line. The second method has the putter moving back "inside" the line and the putterface looking at right angles to the path on which it is moving (illustration #2).

The first method involves a slight counterclockwise rotation of the hands on the backstroke in order to keep the putterface looking down the line. Naturally, this turning of the hands must be reversed on the through stroke to return the clubface squarely to the ball.

The second method, which seems more natural to me, involves no rotation. The putterface merely opens and shuts like the opening and closing of a door.

I suggest you try both methods and use that which gives you the best results. I further suggest you also apply whichever method you choose to your short shots from around the green.
