State Court Extends Sex Barrier

HARRISBURG (UPI) — Commonwealth Court has given Pennsylvania's Interscholastic Athletic Association (PIAA) the green light for its fall sports programming — with boys and girls competing separately as before.

In a brief, critically-worded order by President Judge James S. Bowman, the state court denied the Pennsylvania Justice Department's application for a preliminary injunction against PIAA.

Judge Bowman's order also denied the Justice Department's plea for a special early hearing date between Aug. 16 and early September. Deputy Attorney General Kathleen Larkin had asked for the early hearing date in order to secure the attendance of those experts who can be most beneficial to the court in exploring the issues raised by this action.

BUT JUDGE BOWMAN noted that the hearing had first been set for last Dec. 13, rescheduled at Justice Department request, and then
