

## Smid is ousted in Volvo tourney

**NORTH CONWAY, N.H.** — Third-seeded Tomas Smid of Czechoslovakia was upset yesterday by Alejandro Gabilan of Argentina, 7-6 (7-3), 7-6 (6-4). Becoming the sixth player eliminated in the first round of the Volvo International Tennis Tournament.

Earlier in the day, Jose-Luis Clerc, the defending champion and No. 3 seed from Argentina, withdrew from the \$25,000 tournament after suffering stomach muscles during an early morning warmup.

Shortly after, the No. 2 seed, Henrik Sundstrom of Sweden, became the fifth seed eliminated in the first two days of play, falling to Siklomo Chikiten of Israel, 7-6 (7-3), 6-4.

Jorge Arrese, 19, of Spain, was entered in place of Clerc but was beaten by Cassio Motta of Brazil, 6-2, 6-4.

Third-seeded Terry Hamall advanced to the second round of the Stavawar Pro Tennis Championship with a 6-6, 6-6 victory over Don Lang at the Delaware Valley Tennis Academy in Wayne.

Top-seeded Peter Heckler gained the quarterfinal round in 16-and-under singles in a junior tournament at Huntingdon Valley Country Club by defeating Tom Seivitz, 6-1, 6-1.

### Hockey

The Flyers announced the signing of six players, including goalie Bob Prosen, to new contracts. In addition to Prosen, 26, who posted a 20-13 record with a 1.14 goals-against average for the Flyers last season, left wingers Lindsay Carson and Ron Plafieck, right wingers Dave Brown and Bob Morante and defenseman Darryl Stanley signed new contracts, the team said. Terms of the agreements were not disclosed.

### Basketball

**HOUSTON** — Terrence Kirkpatrick was fired as assistant men's coach for the University of Houston, but a school spokesman refused to give any details. George Walker, a former forward for the Cougars, will replace Kirkpatrick, school officials announced.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.** — Former University of South Carolina women's coach Pam Parsons and former player Tina Beck have dropped the appeal of their unsuccessful libel lawsuit against Sports Illustrated magazine for a story that reported they were lesbian lovers. The decision ends the libel claims against the magazine for a 1982 article that said Parsons carried on an affair with Beck, a player at the time, and was asked to resign from the school in late 1983 because of that involvement.

### Football

**WASHINGTON** — Congress was told that NCAA officials should blame themselves for losing lucrative television contracts, because their threats against major football powers led to the lawsuit that invalidated the agreements. College Football Association executive director Charles M. Nease said the NCAA threatened "severe sanctions, including probation and exclusion

from all NCAA meets and tournaments" when officials learned that the CFA was considering its own television agreement. Nease testified before a House energy and commerce subcommittee that is studying the effects of the 7-5 Supreme Court ruling last month that invalidated the NCAA's exclusive television arrangement.

### Miscellany

University of Cincinnati president Joseph Steger named football coach Dave Curry acting athletic director, replacing Mike McDev, who resigned the post to become AD at Southern California. The Major Indoor Soccer League will hold a dispersal draft for Buffalo Stallion and Phoenix Pride players starting at noon today in Philadelphia. The draft is for players not sold before yesterday's 5 p.m. deadline for dealing the contracts of the players from the two teams. Buffalo and Phoenix have been trying to unload their players since they received permission from the MFL on July 18 to take a one-year leave of absence. Brian Von Knorck off-topseeded Marshall Holman, 244-189, to capture the \$15,000 Professional Bowlers Association Houston Open. It was the second consecutive week Holman had lost from the No. 1 position. Penn State's Gary Schwartz, 1983 NCAA Division I women's outdoor track coach of the year, has been named head women's track and field coach at the University of Tennessee. Schwartz replaces Terry Crawford, who resigned July 2 to accept a similar post at the University of Texas. Junior featherweight Ron Cisneros (227) stopped Carmelo Negrete (164) in the seventh round of a scheduled 10-round bout in Atlantic City. Negrete was about 54 on each of the three judges' scorecards when he walked into Cisneros' right hand at the start of the seventh round. Blood poured from a half-inch gash on Negrete's forehead, and after a check by ring physician, referee Paul Vent stopped the fight at 28 seconds of the round.

## Dobbs wins Phila. Open by two at Indian Valley

Old Tether Country Club pro Frank Dobbs had a strong opening round yesterday morning and carried through in the afternoon to win the Philadelphia Open Golf Championship with a 3-under-par 36-hole score of 68-73-141 at the Indian Valley Country Club.

Dobbs, consistently among the leaders in Philadelphia PGA tournaments this season, birdied four holes in a row starting with the 12th in fitting, a 5-under-par opening round of 37-148. He also birdied the 18th. Dobbs finished the Golf Association of Philadelphia tournament with a 2-stroke lead and took away \$1,300 from the \$7,160 purse.

Ed Dougherty, former touring pro from Edgemoor Country Club, did not defend the championship but was last year with 138 strokes at Rolling Green Golf Club.

A second-place tie developed between Gene Fieger, an assistant pro at Rolling Green, and Jim Kania, an amateur from Overbrook Golf Club. Each completed rounds of 72 and 71 for 143 strokes. Because of his amateur status, Kania did not receive the \$1,000 prize money for second place.

Paul Walsh, a Philadelphia Country Club amateur who stood out in junior competition last year, surprised with a morning performance of 3-under-par 69. He followed with a 75 and led for fourth place at 140 with Jack Connolly of Huntingdon Valley Country Club, the Philadel-

phia PGA president, and West Chester's Jerry Day, Connolly and Day earned 87-85 apiece.

Pro considered to have little potential — Dick Smith, the Philadelphia PGA champion, Harold Perry, former Philadelphia Open Champion, and Rick Oberly, Pete Oakley, Gary Hardin and Willie Schell — had scores ranging from 145 to 149.

The Women's Golf Association of Philadelphia staged four hand-picked tournaments for the benefit of the J. Wood Plant Cadillac-Scholarship Trust, drawing a total of 420 players. Score was on the Pro-Cup system: three points allotted for a par, five for a birdie, seven for an eagle, nine for a hole-in-one. The top prize for a bogey, Class A honors went to Mrs. Bernard Canavan, with 52 points on her Philadelphia Country Club course. Class B was shared by Hilda Kullinger of Manufacturers and Mrs. John Penlin of Philadelphia Country Club, with 42 points at Manufacturers Golf & Country Club. Class C went to Mrs. Harold Hense of Waynesborough, with 74 points at North Hill Country Club, and winner, in Class D, with 64 points at Waynesborough Country Club, was Mrs. John Patton of Rolling Green and Mrs. Michael Munro and Mrs. Robert Clover of Sandy Run.
