

Becker wins in first match since Wimbledon

Wimbledon champion Boris Becker overcame five match points to win the second set and went on to end Sweden's Michael Persson bid for a major upset in the second round of the U.S. Open Clay Court Championships last night in Indianapolis.

The 17-year-old Becker, seeded third in this tournament, rallied for a 44-74, 62 triumph with a 194 verdict in the tiebreaker as they battled some 24 hours.

Persson, a two-time NCAA champion who will be a senior at the University of Georgia this fall, trailed the crowd of 1,200 as he took the first set and opened a 6-5 edge in the second.

Persson, No. 366 in the latest computer ratings and only 23rd in the tour this year, was up, 40-1, in the 12th game and serving for the match before Becker rallied with the help of a double fault to tie the set and force the tiebreaker.

Burt Hunt of Perth, Australia, defeated fifth-seeded Pete Sampras, 6-2, 6-4, to gain the third round of the U.S. Open in a 55-minute first-round match.

Top-seeded Susan Tomancik of Corpus Christi, Texas, defeated Kristi Perry of Fort Worth, 6-1, 6-3, to reach the second round.

Maccabiah record falls in 10,000

TEL AVIV — American Dan Schuster set a Maccabiah Games record of 29 minutes, 30.70 seconds yesterday in the 10,000-meter run, knocking exactly 35 seconds off the previous mark, as the United States increased its medal tally to 216.

Twins sisters Nora and Sarah Collas of Ohio took the gold and silver medals in the 100-meter run, in 19.85 and 20.13 seconds respectively, and Charles Greene won the men's 100-meter relay, bringing the United States total to 104 gold, 81 silver and 47 bronze medals in the 12th Maccabiah Games.

Host Israel also had a good day, taking over second place with 52 gold, 52 silver and 81 bronze medals. Israeli Amos Mandorff defeated countryman Gilad Bloom in the men's singles, 44-62, to win the gold.

Israel also carried off all the medals in the men's 800-meter run, won by Mark Handelman with a record-breaking 1:49.20, and the gold and bronze in the women's 800-meter, taken by Orli Kladovay in 55.80 seconds.

Israel also took all the medals in women's long and high jump, and

gold in men's team foil fencing, women's air pistol and volleyball.
