The Association includes 151 Member Clubs spread across Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware. It offers more than 70 tournaments annually, conducts educational seminars, encourages the game's growth through Junior golf

opportunities and provides handicapping and course rating services to its membership. Additionally, the J. Wood Platt Caddie Scholarship Trust — the Association's charitable arm — distributes financial aid to caddies in pursuit of a higher education. Since J.
